none; for deliverance, but it is far away.

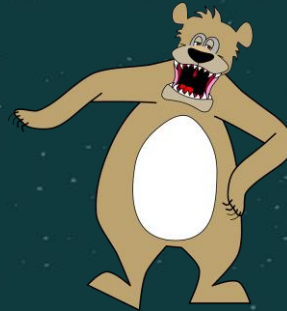
