Romans chapter thirteen verses three and four say the following:

But if thou do that which is evil, be afraid; for he beareth not the sword in vain: for he is the minister of God, a revenger to execute wrath upon him that doeth evil. (KJV)

It could be reasonably inferred that these verses go both ways, meaning that if a ruler ceases to be a terror to evil works and instead is a terror to good works, a Christian should take action.
